- 3. Walks brochure. We might ask the Gazette and Hampton High Road if they would publicize it for us in their papers.
- 4. Significant Tracts. Plans are to spend most of the next meeting discussing the list and making changes. An updated list will be sent to members before then.
- 5. Invasives. Marcia brought 7 common invasives in for a refresher on identification. They were: barberry, bittersweet, multi-flora rose, garlic mustard, knotweed and two honeysuckles.
- 6. Recycling. Discussion brought up ideas of better signs, and use of posters showing benefits of recycling. Why canot ours be single stream? Members will each look into what other small towns around us are doing and report back next meeting.

New Business:

- 1. Goals. Members are to come up with some goals for the HCC for discussion at the next meeting.
- 2. Vegware. Chairman Thompson showed samples of plates, cups and "silverware" made from vegetable matter and fully compostable.
- 3. The Windham County Conservation Consortium will have a meeting April 30th in Brooklyn at 7:00 pm. Topic is lakes.
