1. Call to Order

5. Old Business
 - a. 100% Hampton Survey Results & Planning
Analysis of the data is in progress. Kate will request the town hall as the venue for a presentation of the survey information and the 100% campaign in early December. The presentation will be the first event of a series being planned, tentatively to include energy efficiency, heat pumps and solar in February, a film in March, electric cars in April and a film in June.  - b. Solar Monitor
Bob met with Tom Shippee in the Town Hall where the monitor was found to be broken. The monitor data is not being sent to the Solar Log Dashboard.

 - c. Killingly Gas Plant Update & Action
The Connecticut Siting Council approved the application for construction, maintenance, and operation of a 550-megawatt dual-fuel combined cycle electric generating facility and associated electrical interconnection switchyard to be located at 180 and 189 Lake Road in Killingly. The Alexander Lake Association has filed an appeal of the decision. There is a vigil each Saturday from 11 to noon at the Killingly Commons shopping center. People are encouraged to contact Governor Lamont to voice their concerns. Information on the plant can be found at the Connecticut Siting Council website: ct.gov/csc. The Docket number is 470B.
