Kate prepared a budget for the grant and we discussed metrics for reporting success of program, which is part of the application. Jon will research reporting options and ask Nick for help on metrics. If possible, he will send it around to committee members (the grant is submitted electronically and there may not be an option to print it). He will submit it by June 30 deadline. We will discuss options for composters once we hear if we are receiving the grant.

c. Updates- Solar Production, HES lighting

The recessed fixtures and LED bulbs were installed. The superintendent said that the lighting is fantastic and a great improvement.

REC monitoring noted that the solar panel production was dropping off. C-TEC Solar found something to repair. C-TEC will schedule to do repair.

d. Updates-Killingly, legislation

There has been no change in the Killingly fracked gas electricity generation plant permitting or court case.

There will be vigils at Killingly Commons from 11 to noon on the first and third Saturday of every month – June 5 & 19.
