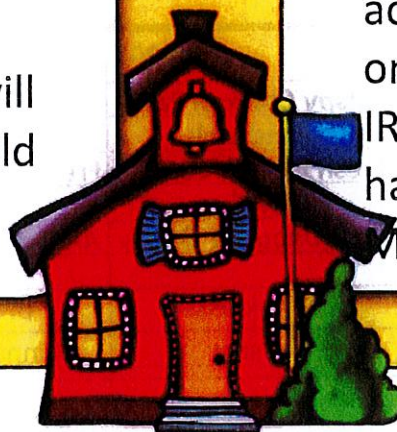
SEL
