Progress monitoring is taking place with iReady winter diagnostic and NWEA winter sessions as well as getting ready for SBAC testing.

SBAC testing will take place for Team B in early April.

Progress monitoring is used to assess students' academic performance, quantify their rates of improvement or progress toward goals, and determine how they are responding to instruction. With this information, we look at what we are doing in class and make adjustments.

SBAC

Student practice is needed to navigate the screens for the SBAC test. We have already begun this aspect.

The purpose of the Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments is to assess student knowledge and skills in English language arts/literacy and mathematics, as well as how much students have improved since the previous year. We use this information to improve our delivery of the curriculum, how we teach, and to reassess our programs.


