## Thursday, June 24 – “The Biggest Little Farm”

The Biggest Little Farm chronicles the eight-year quest of John and Molly Chester as they trade city living for 200 acres of barren farmland and a dream to harvest in harmony with nature. Through dogged perseverance and embracing the opportunity provided by nature's conflicts, the Chester's unlock and uncover a biodiverse design for living that exists far beyond their farm, its seasons, and our wildest imagination. THE BIGGEST LITTLE FARM provides us all a vital blueprint for better living and a healthier planet. (92 min)

## Thursday, July 29 - “2040”

Award-winning director Damon Gameau embarks on a journey to explore what the future would look like by the year 2040 if we simply embraced the best solutions already available to us to improve our planet and shifted them into the mainstream. Structured as a visual letter to his 4-year-old daughter, Damon blends traditional documentary footage with dramatized sequences and high-end visual effects to create a vision board for his daughter and our planet.

"2040" points a practical, achievable path toward solutions, but its most important contribution is a sense that change is possible. Gameau says that he wants "to create a vision of a different future" with "an exercise in fact-based dreaming." This film does not scold us; it is hopeful. (92 min)
