Re: State Board of Education Equity Policy Statement

The State Board has updated its Equity Policy Statement (attached). Below are thoughts on the Statement and my concern over developments in other states:

According to a recent article in *USA Today* (May 13), legislators in several states, have introduced bills that would prohibit schools from teaching 'divisive,' 'racist 'or 'sexist' concepts. According to the article, the "focus of these bills is to stamp out conversations about race and equity."
