

Each animal eligible for adoption is fully evaluated by our staff and we seek the best match possible. Since 2004, **NECCOG has placed more than 3,200 animals** and we have not had to put any animal down due to a lack of space – all animals (with the exception of diseased or temperament issues) that can be placed with an appropriate owner are so placed.

While our program is paid by the participating towns, we are always in need of **donations** (cash or items) to cover expenses such as veterinarian bills, food and other items to make our animals more comfortable.
